

## Articulated College Credit for College Tech Prep Students

College Tech Prep students **may** earn college credit at Youngstown State University for coursework completed as part of their high school program. In all cases students must demonstrate mastery of the subject area through teacher evaluation, testing, or other means. The college credits appear on a student's college transcript once they have completed one full semester (16 hours) at Youngstown State University. Completion of the appropriate application for credit is the responsibility of the student. Students who desire credit should consult with their high school teacher and/or the appropriate university contact person.
